

SHI Board Communiqué - February 2023

The SHI Board met on 28th of February 2023 and discussed the following matters:

Board Chair – topics for discussion

 The Chair opened the meeting and also congratulated Associate Professor Aaron Robinson on his recent appointment as Chair of the Victorian Faculty of the Australasian College of Dermatologists.

Strategic planning

- The Board noted the Institute's Strategic Plan 2020-23 was coming to its end this year and discussed the scope and objectives for a strategic planning session to be held in March 2023.
- It was agreed the scope of planning session would include a review of the organisation's Vision and reflections on the outputs from the previous Strategic Plan.
- The Board agreed the focus of this planning cycle should be on the medium to longer term and, in particular, aspirations for the Institute in 5 years' time.
- The Board also discussed the benefits of including a number of stakeholders in addition to the Board and Leadership Team. i.e., capturing the insights and perspectives from nurses, a plastic surgeon, and a registrar.

Collaboration with the Skin Hospital

- The CEO briefed the Board on opportunities to collaborate with the Skin Hospital in NSW, including an upcoming workshop in Sydney to be attended by an SHI delegation.
- It was noted the upcoming collaboration would focus on high-level processes and systems that drive success: such as patient flows, administrative team structure, patient management systems, billing processes, and debtor management.

Operational updates

- Activities underway to improve billing practices and debtor management.
- GP engagement and building increased capacity for urgent GP referrals.
- Trends in theatre utilisation and surgical activity.
- New corporate website and Learning Management System.
- The successful Pillars of Dermatology Symposium and Novartis partnership.

<u>Sub-committee reports – Finance, Audit and Risk Management committee</u>

- The Board discussed the committee's focus on accountability and oversight of the financial sustainability plan objectives; and reaffirmed the Board's ongoing support for the strategy currently underway.
- FARM Chair Jim Power, briefed the Board on YTD performance compared to budget, noting
 the shortfall in clinical services income and that expenses have been fairly well managed to
 date.



- Board members noted that YTD clinical services revenue was up substantially in comparison to the same time last year.
- The Board discussed the Australasian Dermatology Registry build and associated funding requirements.

Sub-committee reports – Clinical Governance committee

- The Board received an update on the Clinical Governance Committee's discussions the minimum patient age and implications for the Inclusion/Exclusion and Partnering with Consumers policies, noting that SHI had commenced accepting referrals for patients 12 years and older in some clinics.
- The Board was informed that the Clinical Governance Committee had endorsed and provided advice on plans to increase SHI's capacity to accept urgent GP referrals.

Health promotion

• The Board discussed opportunities to further develop opportunities with health promotion agencies. The Board was pleased to note that VicHealth's CEO, Dr Sandro Demaio, will be a guest speaker at the first All-Staff Forum for the year.
